




SES (Percentage of Students Qualifying for Free and Reduced Lunch)


SES (Percentage of Students Qualifying for Free and Red...

- I am coaching middle school track. Not sure if that would be considered a leadership role.
- I am on the BLT and have also been asked to join the [...] faculty leadership team [...]
- Middle School student council, high school assistant track coach, middle school volleyball
- I was asked to lead GameSpot, an after school gaming group.
- Have been highly involved with coaching in three seasons
- I helped coach Middle School Track this year, which was a leadership role in the form of athletics. I got to work with 7th and 8th grade track athletes and get to know students in an atmosphere outside of the school setting.

- Was in charge of a study skills seminar we put together for the freshman class. It was designed with what we saw as weaknesses of the class, in hopes that it would help them succeed more as they progress through high school and make the transition from middle school to high school easier.

As a graduate of the Malone Teacher Education Program, in what areas did you feel especially well prepared?

Responses (12)

- I am well prepared with intervention strategies and working with students in a diverse classroom.
- I felt extremely comfortable with my experience with technology. The class helped very much! I felt prepared to write IEP's and hold meetings.
- My area of being well prepared was in seeking advice. Things do not always work out the way that they were planned, and a second plan is needed. Malone taught me the value of seeking others out that could give advice and new ideas on a subject. Being stuck is never a fun aspect and the best way to get through that is to ask.
- I feel especially well prepared in the area of servitude. I look at my role as an educator as a self-sacrificing position. I am here to serve and love every single student with which I come into contact. This also includes the difficult and unlovable students. It has broken my heart this year to see my coworkers not have the same feeling. I have actually had a coworker tell me multiple times that I need to give up on a student because he is not going to amount to anything away. As this year has progressed, I have become overwhelmingly more and more grateful for my training at Malone. I was taught to view my students as human beings with potential and, more importantly, children of God.
- Being professional, planned, and asking peers for advice/help.
- Setting clear expectations and classroom management strategies
- I feel very prepared in teaching as a service, not for personal gain. Also, I feel prepared in my ability to write lesson plans and lead instruction. I feel prepared in coming up with creative ideas to teach lessons, and to lead IEP meetings.
- Communication, compassion, being prepared for the job market
- I felt especially well prepared with a mindset of serving our students and the other staff and teachers. I also felt well prepared in the areas of assessments, socially-development of adolescents, and the ways to differentiate a lesson to reach all students.
- Reading preparation teaching life skills such as respect
- I felt prepared in several areas. I found my student teaching experience to be the most valuable. I think that when I started my student teaching and took the ED TPA class, I made a great deal of progress. I became much better at running a classroom in every way.
- Knowledgeable in the area of education laws and finding ways to use multi-modality in the classroom.

As a graduate of the Malone Teacher Education Program, in what areas did you feel especially unprepared? Responses (12)

- The technology taught was not necessarily conducive to classroom settings. Our school district uses google for everything. Teachers use smart board in the classrooms. I spent a lot of time in applied technology learning about information (although very challenging and interesting) did not prepare me to step into the classroom setting.
- I felt slightly unprepared when it came time to find a job. I felt as though I wasn't sure of how to deal with all the rejections. It worried me a lot!
- As a Malone Graduate I feel like even with all of the classes and experience I only had a slight idea as to what I actually was doing the first year of teaching. This has been an on the job training, kind of learning experience. I am not sure that there is much that could be done about that, since somethings simply are not the same as the first year.

- The only area that I wish I had gained more knowledge in prior to entering into the work force is the teacher evaluation systems (such as OTES and value-added data). I wouldn't classify this as especially unprepared considering my in-depth preparation for the RESA from EdTPA but I do admit that it is a gap in my knowledge.
- Dealing with behavior issues and being creative in classroom lessons.
- How to work with other staff/teachers whose ideas and beliefs and values and priorities differ greatly from my own convictions
- I felt unprepared in behavioral interventions and handling difficult parents. I feel that I could've been better prepared in the IEP writing process and activities for students in middle/high school grades.
- Technology long term lesson and unit planning in sanction with standards.
- I graduated with a Middle Ed. License but got a job in Special Education, so I didn't feel especially prepared in the whole Special Education department, specifically with the IEP. I also did not feel specifically prepared in the area of curriculum mapping (creating a year plan based on standards, specifically with ELA because they can be so much more broad than in math).
- varied assessments
- My behavior management skills were lacking, but I think that is true of any new teacher. I think the technology classes could
 be a little more relevant. I really didn't see the point in taking a Photoshop class. But to be fair, I could have put more effort
 into my other technology-centric classes.
- Dealing with students from low SES backgrounds. Working with students who have been abused in some way. In special education preparing transition plans for high school age kids. Felt very prepared as an elementary IS, but when moved to the high school did not feel prepared.

What changes would you suggest in order to improve the Malone Teacher Education Program? Responses (11)

- Adapt courses and work load requirements to a graduate student life style so that schedules are adaptable to students
 working full time. Often professors assumed that the graduate students were already in the education field and course
 assignments were set up based on that misunderstanding. Often, students were adjusting work schedules to accommodate
 assignments that could only be completed during the day.
- I would suggest that more time be taken on how to start the year. There are lesson plans and how to do behavior aspects, but getting a good start would be very helpful.
- As mentioned above, more information regarding the teacher evaluation system after RESA
- More education classes for math majors (integrated subjects)
- The Malone Teacher Education program couldn't be made better! I am so blessed to have gotten to prepare academically, experientially, and spiritually for my teaching career at Malone University. From day 1, I was well prepared. Thank you to the faculty and staff for all you do for us throughout the process of preparing our hearts and minds for servant leadership in schools. Thank you for the guidance, the care, the prayers. Malone really is a special place.
- More focus on middle/high school interventions (it mainly focused on early childhood). IEP writing instruction.
- An emphasis on year long planning
- From the experience I've gained in one year, it is evident that so much of what I may not have learned at school just needed to be experienced in order to truly learn it! Malone has an awesome Teacher Education Program from what I've experienced! One thing I might add in would be to tie in preparing for State Tests/what that looks like as a teacher. I also would suggest going over the Value-Added program that accompanies the State Tests because I haven't felt like I have a solid understanding of it.

- content classes to be based more to standards
- I would get rid of the diversity class taught by Dr. Romano (if it's still offered) and try to make the classes more relevant to what teachers do in and out of the classroom and not focus so much on educational theories.
- For the IS program less focus on the elementary aspect and put a little more into the upper levels.

Other comments:

Responses (5)

- The availability of classes offered conflicted often with being able to use financial aid. You need 5 credit hours to use financial aid and there were times where there was only once course offered and there was not enough credits so I would need to pay out of pocket. Summer school classes were set up Monday Thursday 6:00 10:00 which was fine unless you worked full time during the summer, again not in the educational field, and you needed to complete assignments due for the next day. There was not time allowed for the completion of those assignments worked into the schedule.
- Malone has done a great job of preparing me!
- I am thankful for all I learned at Malone and for the opportunity to go through Malone's Teacher Education Program!
- Overall, I was satisfied with the program. If anything, I wish I would have put more into it and tried harder.
- You can only prepare us so much, because nothing can prepare for all the ups and downs of teaching. Except for the transition planning for high schoolers, I felt prepared and that I had a good foundation for eventually becoming an effective educator.
