

Chief executive officer of Desidara, **Sue Grabowski**, is deeply connected to the Malone community as a graduate, a Pioneer parent, and serves as the secretary of the Board

of Trustees. In her address to this year's graduates, she challenged them to look to Jesus as the greatest example for navigating truth in a divided society. As we interact with others in daily life—juggling isolation, accelerated technological advances, and "cancel culture"—we can remember that Jesus never

discarded the truth while, at the same time, offering hope.

"In a cagey society, people are looking for Due North, and we know Who to point them to," she said. "But will we? The world needs men and women who are bold yet gentle, and unwavering in conviction.
