What is Pendle Hill?

After six years of seeking God's will, call, and purpose for his life, *George Fox* climbed Pendle Hill. When he reached the summit, he saw a vision of "a great people to be gathered" into God's Kingdom. This epiphany led him to establish the Society of Friends. Malone's founders, *Walter* and *Emma Malone*, also experienced a visionary, vocational calling and, in 1892, founded Cleveland Bible Institute, which later became Malone University.

We desire that all Malone students have their own Pendle Hill experiences while enrolled at Malone.

Provide opportunities for "Pendle Hill moments" in which students seek God's calling and vocational purpose

Students will take classes in their major and General Education (liberal arts core) that help them to seek God's calling as a means of seeking Christ's Kingdom First.



Provide advising and mentoring to walk the Pendle Hill Path

Students will receive access to advising, mentoring, and guidance to help them work out their callings as a means of developing meaningful and purposeful lives that include service to church, community, and world.



Provide experiential learning along the Path

Students will take classes in their major and General Education (liberal arts core) that allow them to complete at least one of the following: a) an internship/practicum, b) a major research project, c) a semester off-campus program, or d) a course that requires significant service learning. Students who complete all four types of experiences will receive special recognition.



Provide career help in the curricular Path

Students will have access to career planning, preparation, mentoring, and networking in the curriculum in order to help students find meaningful careers.
