- Official transcripts from all colleges attended

Students with fewer than 12 transferrable credits will also submit:

- + Final high school transcript
- Standardized test score, used for placement purposes*

Students planning to compete in NCAA Div. II athletics will submit:

+ NCAA eligibility at www.eligibilitycenter.org

* For most students, an ACT or SAT score will be sufficient. If you did not take the ACT or SAT, and you have been out of high school for more than two years, you may need to take the Accuplacer test. Please check with your admissions counselor.

GUIDELINES FOR TRANSFERRING CREDITS

- Coursework at other regionally-accredited institutions, for which you have earned a grade of C or better, will usually be accepted as transfer credit.
- Grade point average (GPA) does not transfer; however a GPA for all coursework within the major (including transfer courses) will be calculated.
- Transfer credits will be posted to your permanent transcript after you have completed at least 15 credit hours at Malone with a GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- + After your file has been assessed for credit transfer, the evaluation report will be available from the Admissions Office.
- To graduate, you must complete at least 30 credit hours at Malone, including at least 12 hours in your major.

WHEN SHOULD I APPLY?

Malone admits applicants on a rolling basis, but we encourage transfer students to apply by March 1 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester. This allows enough time to process the paperwork.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID?

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The priority filing deadline is March 1. Apply as early as possible for maximum financial aid consideration. Malone's FAFSA code is 003072.

ARE THERE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR TRANSFERS?

Transfer students who enroll full time may be eligible to receive scholarships based on cumulative grade point average. Visit www.malone.edu/financialaid.

WHEN CAN I VISIT?

Transfer students are welcome to visit whenever it's convenient. We offer special *Transfer Tuesdays* just for you! Register at www.malone.edu/visit.

WHEN AM I ABLE TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES?

You can register after being accepted as a transfer student and paying the \$200 enrollment deposit (non-refundable after May 1). Registration can begin as early as April for fall semester and November for spring semester classes.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

The process is simple: apply at www.malone.edu/apply and contact your previous school(s) to request a copy of your official transcript(s).
