HISTORY SENIOR SEMINAR

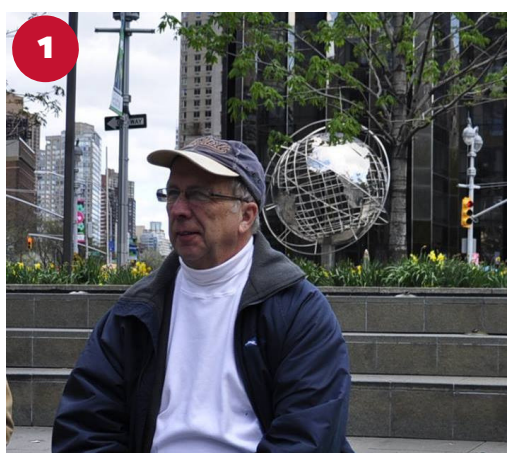

1 KEITH MARTIG '70

After graduating from Malone, I worked at Akron City Hospital and used their employee benefit to pursue my graduate degree in Guidance & Counseling at the University of Akron. Upon graduation from UA,

I was a member of my local school board for 26 years and also a member of the Malone Board of Trustees for 6 years from 2002 to 2007.

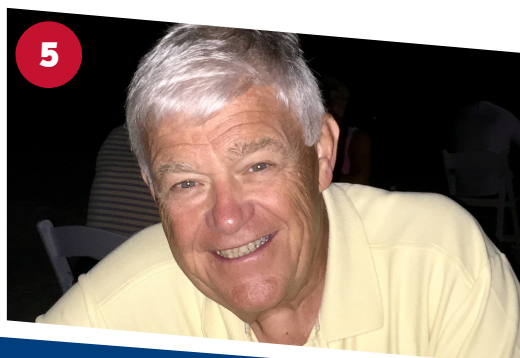
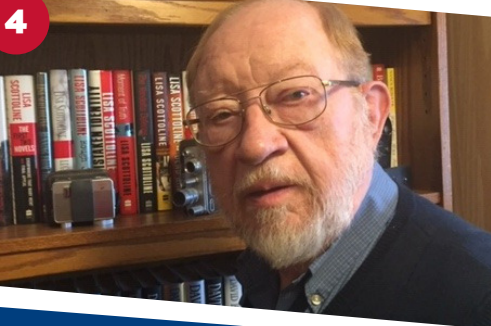
