HONORS PRESENTATIONS



MARINA RARICK '20

Marina is a junior Integrated Social Studies major and is a course assistant, aiding with freshman orientation. She presented her Honors Thesis at the end of Spring semester.

Her topic was as follows: What is the relationship between the ordinary, individual, Southeastern Ohio woman's correspondence with Union soldiers and the overall ability of women to assist the Union cause in community with one another and through associations?

POLI SCI SENIOR SEMINAR

Students have been hard at work writing extensive research papers on topics that interest them.

D.J. Brown investigated whether acute water scarcity contributed to political unrest in Jordan and Syria in the 2011 Arab Spring. **Jeff Dieringer** did a comparative study of banking regulations in Canada and the United States, assessing whether the US repeal of regulations in 1999 contributed to the financial crisis of 2008-2009. **Hannah Masloski** examined the role of pro-Israel campaign contributions to presidential election results in 1992 and 2012.

They presented the results of their research at the Walsh University All Politics is Local Conference on Saturday, April 27.
